**The K30 is a trans-NIH program administered by NHLBI. In addition two institutions have received K30s from NCCAM.

***The NIH Pathway to Independence (PI) Award (K99/R00; announced January 7, 2006) is a combined career development-research grant. It provides 2 years of funding for a mentored research experience, followed by 3 years of research support as the grant holder transitions into the first independent faculty position (or equivalent). There are no citizenship requirements for this grant mechanism. K99 support is limited to \$90,000/yr, while total costs may not exceed \$249,000/year in the R00 phase.
